## Big Bend High School awarded \$1,000 prize

SOUTH BREWSTER COUNTY - On January 13, 1998, students of Big Bend High School (BBHS) were awarded one thousand dollars as the first place winners of the Amoco School Recycling Challenge.

State Rep. Pete P. Gallego was on hand to present the award to Wendy W. Flippo, BBHS science teacher.

By presenting recycling lessons in class and carrying out

recycling projects, Flippo and the physical science and biology classes met the requirements of the statewide challenge.

Of the 150 applicants, the Big Bend group was chosen for first place in the secondary school category.

As representative of the Texas Natural Resources Conservation Commission, Frank Espino from El Paso attended the ceremony, as did Barbara Kaufman, from the Rio Grande Council of Governments.

Plans for using the award money include expanding the existing recycling program at the school, and establishing a composting and gardening project.
