## HOLLYWOOD COMES TO THE CHILYMPIAD PEDRO GONZALEZ-GONZALEZ

The story of comedian Pedro Gonzalez-Gonzalez' sensational jump to national fame began with his appearance in a United Cerebral Palsy Benefit show in his home town, San Antonio; Texas, that was produced by Chilympiad consultant Jim Battersby.

Pedro played a marimba number of frying pans and his act was the hit of the show. This was nothing new for the slender, mustachioed youth of Mexican descent. His comedy routines had been popular in San Antonio's Mexican theaters for a long time, and also in other theaters in the Mexican border circuit.

But he was seen performing at the benefit by Walter O'Keefe, a big-time television producer. O'Keefe told Groucho Marx' writer about him and pretty soon Pedro was given a ticket to Hollywood and the opportunity to appear on the Groucho Marx TV show "You Bet Your Life."

Groucho advised Pedro to be natural, to play it straight, and that's what he did. For half an hour he topped every line expert funnyman Groucho said to him, and he won $\$ 350$, the only money he got outside of his expenses.

Pedro had returned to San Antonio by the time the filmed TV show appeared. Everybody began looking for him and no one could locate the sensational new comedy star. Pedro himself had no idea of the flurry he had caused. He didn't own a TV set, and hadn't seen the show.

After newspaper columnists took up the hunt, he was located through his father, Jose S. Gonzalez, who lives in Venice, California near Hollywood. Young Pedro was rushed back to Hollywood by the William Morris talent agency and soon after was signed to a contract by Batjac Productions (Wayne-Fellows) and made his screen debut in "Wings of the Hawk," playing a comedy insurrectionist.

Then he did roles in "Ring of Fear" and "Ricochet Romance" and was given his first solid part in "The High and the Mighty." Pedro's portrayal of the merchant ship radio operator on the sliding chair stamped him as a player with real talent, an experienced performer who

had the ability to follow through on his one or ight TV sensation.

Pedro has won his best screen role to date in Howard Hawks' "Rio Bravo," a Warner Bros, release starring John Wayne, Dean Martin, Ricky Nelson, Walter Brennan and Ward Bond. He portrays the proprietor of a small Texas border-fown hotel who helps his friend, John Wayne, in a time of need.

Pedro now lives in Culver City with his wife and three children Rosario, 20; Yolanda, 19; Pedro, Jr., 17. He owns his home and. likes cooking enchiladads and hamburgers with hot chili sauce.

## NEW EXHIBIT - THUNDERBIRDS

Thunderbird was a mythical bird supposed to cause thunder; lightning and rain, and symbolizing "power, swiftness and prosperity". Thus Ford Motor Co. named its "personal car" of the 50 's.
Ford Motor Co. introduced its first personal sized Thunderbird in 1955 and its last in 1957. During this period of the 50 's only 51,113 of the T-Birds were produced for the American market and approx. 1843 were exported to the world market. Approximately 30,000 remain road-worthy.

This automobile came equipped with a V-8 engine and a choice of 3 -speed, 3 -speed with overdrive, or automatic transmission and bucket-type seats. Other standard features were a removeable hard top and tachometer. Options were a soft top that could be stored behind the seat, electric windows and seats, a radio that would increase volume automatically with
speed, a power seat that would return to position automatically, power steering, power brakes, clock.
In 1958 Ford Motor Co. decided to produce a large 4 -passenger Thunderbird, thus ending the era of the "personal luxury car". People wanting to preserve the " 2 -seat" $T$-Bird formed an international organization called the Classic Thunderbird Club International and now have approximately 4,000 members and over 40 chapters throughout the world. Through their devotion and perseverance they have successfully persuaded FoMoCo to reproduce needed parts to preserve this classic.
New, this automobile sold for $\$ 3,300.00$ plus, and now 15 years later a "Bird" in very good shape can bring what it did new.
Hence, we will show our T-Birds at this parade so that you might enjoy them as much as the proud owners do.
